The 2020 Cadillac Escalade stands as a testament to luxury SUV design, boasting an imposing presence and a storied legacy. Its truck-based architecture combines a robust V8 engine with an impressive towing capacity of up to 8,300 pounds, offering both luxury and practicality. Inside, you'll find a serene cabin, three rows of seating, and an array of features. However, the Escalade's truck roots also bring drawbacks, like less refined ride quality and handling compared to other luxury SUVs.

Despite its opulence, the Escalade's cargo space is somewhat limited and challenging to load. Now halfway through its current generation, signs of aging are apparent, with spy shots of a redesigned model circulating. This might influence your decision to wait for the next-generation Escalade or explore alternatives like the Lincoln Navigator and Mercedes-Benz GLS, which offer more overall appeal.

The Escalade's luxury is further accentuated by its chrome-laden exterior and upscale amenities like leather interiors, heated and ventilated seats, and self-parking assist. The powerful V-8 engine, available in both rear- and all-wheel drive, ensures a commanding performance. Although available in short- and long-wheelbase models, the extended Escalade ESV offers more room and cargo space. While it shares elements with other GM models, the Escalade's higher price tag and lack of ride refinement compared to its corporate siblings, the GMC Yukon and Chevy Tahoe, are notable. Despite evoking a Hollywood lifestyle aura, the 2020 Cadillac Escalade stops short of offering a complete red-carpet experience.
