
South Florida Flood Leaves Cars Under Water

South Florida has been hit by heavy rainfall in recent days, causing flooding in many low-lying areas and neighborhoods. Temporary pumps were deployed in various locations, but some areas still experienced minor flooding, such as Edgewater. The situation has resulted in cars being towed out of flooded streets, and people attempting to drive through floodwaters, which is not advisable.

The heavy rainfall caused the closure of Fort Lauderdale's airport and all Broward public schools, resulting in flight delays and cancellations and affecting many parents who were unable to take their children to school.
